## Quarter 1: Identity

### Grade 10




Students are completing "Road Maps" exploring significant events in their life thus far and focusing on analyzing the importance of these steps in one's journey and identity. This quarter students will study essential standards: RLO4, RLO3, RLO2, RLO5 as they study the novel, Of Mice and Men by John Steinbeck. After reading, students will complete an argumentative writing piece examining the different roles of each character in the book . Students will also read an independent choice novel and write a formal written essay.

### Grade 9



Students are currently working on a "Must Read Banner" project that represents their favorite book and will also begin studying the unique writing style of Sandra Cisneros's award winning novella, The House on Mango Street. Lessons will centered about the standards: RLO3, RLO4, RLO5, RLO2 and we will end the unit with students writing their own narrative vignette based on our topic of identity. Independent reading will serve as our homework with the expectation that all students will read a self selected book and then complete a written response based on a given prompt.

### Grade 8



Students are creating an "Autobiography Book Cover" that will hang in our classrooms for the entirety of the school year. The eighth graders will also study the focus standards RL03, RL06, RL04, RL01, RL02 while reading, A Long Walk to Water by Linda Sue Park and then write narrative piece at the end of this unit. For homework, our students will choose an independent reading novel that will serve as the basis of a literary analysis choice board assignment at the end of the quarter.

### Grade 7



Students are making a Coat of Arms/Gauntlet as their back-to-school project. Seventh grade focus standards for this quarter are: RLO3, RLO6, RL04, RL01, RL02, RL.07 and lessons including these skills will begin with the study of S.E. Hinton's classic, The Outsiders. The end of unit writing assignment will allow students to reflect on their own identity. Students will also have the opportunity to read a book of their choosing for homework that will also be the basis for a short analysis response.
