

- Grades in Honors classes are WEIGHTED.
- Honors classes are often taken in preparation for the transition to Advanced Placement courses in junior and senior years.

- These accelerated courses prepare students to take the national AP exams (given in the spring) as well as help them prepare for the rigors of college.
- If students score well on the AP exam, they may be granted advanced placement status and/or college credit.
- Advanced Placement Program consists of college-level courses and the exams are governed by the College Board.
- Make sure to think about your time commitments before signing up for an AP course.
- The first AP class a student can take is AP Human Geography, during their Freshman year.









- Dual credit from a college may be granted in specified academic and/or occupational courses.
- Dual credit courses earn both high school and college credit for the same class.
- Payment of tuition to the cooperating community college is required - currently CGCC.
- To gain credit for DE the student must obtain a C or better in the class.


